Introduction:

The School of Biotechnology is a strategic unit in the Faculty of Science and Health at Dublin City University. It is located within a state-of-the-art building, which incorporates both excellent teaching and research facilities. The School is unique in having a broad base of expertise in the areas of bioprocess engineering, biochemistry, environmental engineering, genetics, immunology, microbiology, animal and plant cell culture within a single departmental unit. As a result there is strong emphasis on inter-disciplinary research and teaching within the School.

This interdisciplinarity is further enhanced through close collaboration with centres of excellence based at DCU which include the National Institute for Cellular Biotechnology (NICB), the National Centre for Sensor Research (NCSR), the International Centre for Neurotherapeutics and the recently formed Biomedical Diagnostics Institute, as well as a wide range of Schools within and external to Biotechnology. Collaborations with Irish and International Universities and companies are strongly encouraged.
