Introduction

The institute has around 100 staff collaborating on a wide variety of research projects.

[The Rince Institute](http://www.rince.ie) is recruiting a postdoctoral researcher to work on the energy-efficient design of wired IP networks, as part of the EU-funded [ECONET](http://www.econet-project.eu) Integrated Project (http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/ECONET_Project). The successful candidate will work with both the Network Processing Group and the Switching and Systems Laboratory within RINCE.

Applicants should have a PhD in Telecommunications, Electronic Engineering, Information Engineering or a related discipline. The successful candidate will have experience in a number of the following domains:

- Embedded system design
- VHDL/Verilog/FPGA design
- Network software (especially layer three and below)
- The Linux kernel and device driver design

The researcher will engage in research on the above topics in support of RINCE's contribution to the ECONET project, will assist in the supervision of postgraduate students and others participating in the project, will liaise with the other project partners, and will co-ordinate the production of the DCU deliverables for ECONET, including reports and publications. Strong communications skills in English, both verbally and in writing will be required of the successful candidate.
