Introduction

The School of Education Studies is part of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences. The School has nineteen full-time academic staff and a further twenty-five part-time lecturers and research staff. The School is active in both teaching and research and has expanded rapidly in recent years.

Teaching Programme

At present the School of Education Studies offers 7 taught programmes including the new Graduate Diploma/M.Sc. in Guidance and Counselling, an exciting and innovative programme at undergraduate degree level in Education and Training, a Graduate Diploma in Education and Training, a Masters in Education and Training with both eLearning and Leadership tracks and a Doctorate in Education Leadership. It also provides a large Post Graduate Teacher Education course and works with other Schools to provide concurrent Teacher Education Programmes in Science Education and in Physical Education. In addition the School has attracted a wide range of research students at Masters and Doctoral level.

Research

The School of Education Studies conducts and supervises a wide range of research for external bodies. Recent funded research has included projects for the Department of Education and Science, the National Centre for Guidance in Education, the Commission on the Points System, the European Union 6th Framework, Age and Opportunity, The Department of Energy, Natural Resources and the Gaeltacht and Leonardo DaVinci Research Programmes. Current research includes a range of projects in the field of evaluation of education and training, development of web based learning and online learning environments, intergenerational learning, wellness in students and inclusion of students with SEN students into mainstream education. The School also has a particular research interest in access, equity and pluralism in education. A key area of teaching and research is in the field of Leadership in Education and Training Management.

The School has substantial numbers undertaking Masters and Doctoral programmes by research in areas such as Leadership in Education and Training, Curriculum Development, Nurse Education, the use of ICTs in school, Adult Learning, the impact of new communities on Irish Education Systems, Interculturalism in Education and Instructional Design.

The School of Education Studies has always been committed to all aspects of education and training and has attracted students from across a wide range of disciplines and work environments. The programmes that have been developed by the School reflect a commitment to education and training in Ireland and beyond and to the impact of theory on practice within the modern workplace.

The School requires a candidate that has a strong academic background in the area of Management and Leadership and who also has experience in the industrial/ business field. Our courses are also relevant to the field of Training and the person appointed will get an opportunity to work with a wide range of students from a variety of institutions. The role will also include research related to existing projects and the ability to support our students who are themselves undertaking research in the areas of Management and Leadership.

Applicants for the post must hold an honours degree in a relevant discipline, should be qualified to PhD level and have a strong background and research publication output in the area. They should also have both lecturing and administrative experience. The person appointed will be expected to contribute to teaching on the full range of programmes offered

by the School and to engage in other aspects of the Schools' work, particularly research and programme management. S/He will have a proven record in research with a publication record and experience of bidding for and managing research projects.
