Applicants for the five-year posts must have a Ph.D. Applicants for the one-year posts must have a PhD or be near completion.

The appointments will commence on 1 September 2010.

All applicants must have experience of teaching and research in politics / international relations in a full-time capacity in a university environment and must have a demonstrated commitment to publication of articles in well regarded academic journals and books in leading academic presses.

We welcome all good quality applicants, in any area of politics / international relations research, but the school has particular needs in the following areas and that may be a factor in short-listing and final selection – international security and conflict studies; the politics or political economy of development; international political economy or the comparative politics of Asia, Africa or Latin America.

The successful candidates will be expected to make a significant contribution to the research and teaching profile of the School.

The Centre for International Studies, which is based in the school has led research programmes funded by the Irish Research Council for Humanities and Social Sciences, Irish Aid, the Irish Dept of Foreign Affairs, the EU and international NGOs. The successful candidate will be expected to be committed to and in the case of the 5 year posts have a track record of publication in well-regarded, international academic peer-reviewed journals and they will also be expected to contribute to the ongoing development of the research programmes in the school and the Centre for International Studies.

The successful candidates will also be expected to play a role in the development and delivery of the School's taught programmes: the BA in Economics, Politics and Law, the BA in International Relations, the MA in International Relations, the MA in International Security and Conflict Studies, and the MA in Development. The schools offers excellent opportunities for candidates to teach within their own area of research specialization, as we offer students a wide range of options on Ireland's largest MA programme in international studies.
