As part of its continuing development, the School of Law and Government intends to appoint two new lecturers in Law. The appointments will commence on 1 September 2010.

Applications from candidates with demonstrated academic research expertise and university lecturing experience in any area of law will be accepted, but candidates with teaching and research interests in the following areas are especially welcome:

- company law, contract and/or tort law
- public law, constitutional law or administrative law are especially welcome.

The successful candidates will be expected to be committed to high quality research and publication in well-regarded, academic peer-reviewed journals and they will also be expected to contribute to the development of the research programmes in the School.

The school is committed to high quality research and supports its staff in such work. The Centre for International Studies, which is based in the school has led research programmes funded by the Irish Research Council for Humanities and Social Sciences, Irish Aid, the Irish Dept of Foreign Affairs, the EU and international NGOs. A new Socio-Legal Research Centre has also just been established. The successful candidate will be expected to be committed to research and publication in well-regarded, international academic peer-reviewed journals and they will also be expected to contribute to the ongoing development of the research programmes in the school.

Applicants must have an honours degree and will have experience of teaching and research in law in a university environment. The successful applicant will have a Ph.D. in law at, or near completion.

The successful candidates will also be expected to play a role in the development and delivery of the School's taught programmes and in particular the BA in Economics, Politics and Law, and the new BCL (Law and society) which was launched last year in planning and also in delivering future new developments in law.
