### **Lecturer in Accounting**

An innovative and dynamic Business School, DCUBS offers an extensive range of research and taught programmes at undergraduate, postgraduate, executive and doctoral levels. Working in close collaboration with DCU faculties and theme leaders, business interests in the public and private sectors, and its international partners, the School's portfolio of programmes is regularly updated and expanded to reflect the changing needs of business leaders.

#### **Position**

Reporting to the Dean of DCU Business School, the successful candidate will conduct high quality teaching and research in Accounting and will play an active role in the Accounting Group and in the School more widely. The Accounting Group brings together academics whose research and teaching interests span a wide range of areas that inform the accounting profession and accountants working in industry. Members of the Accounting Group have established a strong international research reputation in the areas of management accounting and control systems, accounting education, accounting history, ethics and the accounting profession. The Accounting Group is primarily responsible for three programmes: the MBS in Accounting, the postgraduate Professional Diploma in Accounting and the B.A. in Accounting and Finance. All of these programmes receive generous exemptions from the professional accountancy bodies. In addition, the group contributes to the full range of academic programmes within DCUBS and the Centre for Executive Programmes.

#### **Main Duties**

##### **1. Teaching**

The successful candidate is expected:

- To contribute to the delivery and development of Accounting modules at DCU in a manner consistent with the highest academic standards
- To use a wide range of learning and teaching methodologies and assessments which foster a deep approach to learning and which equip students with the skills needed to be life long learners
- To work proactively in improving existing modules and programmes
- To contribute to the design and development of new modules and programmes
- To provide research supervision for taught postgraduate students

##### **2. Research**

To contribute to the research activity of DCUBS by:

- Publishing new ideas and findings in national and international journals
- Seeking funds to support research initiatives
- Contributing to research activities such as conferences, seminars etc.
- Supervising postgraduate research students

##### **3. Good Citizenship and External Relations**

To willingly contribute to the activities of the Accounting Group:

- To contribute enthusiastically to the running of DCU Business School's activities through participation in, for example, ad hoc committees, open days, etc.
- To be prepared to contribute to relevant University committees
- To represent DCUBS externally, as appropriate (e.g. committees and activities of professional accountancy bodies)

### **Person Specification**

Candidates must have a relevant honours degree, preferably a 1.1 or 2.1 honour and will have previous teaching and research experience. Candidates must have commenced a PhD or must clearly demonstrate a strong commitment to pursuing a PhD. It is desirable for candidates to hold a professional accounting qualification and a relevant postgraduate qualification. The candidate should also demonstrate excellent interpersonal and communication skills consistent with the highest quality of teaching and learning, together with evidence of successful teamwork and a collegial approach.
