MA in Sexuality Studies

The School of Applied Language and Intercultural Studies (SALIS) and the School of Nursing (SON) are in the process of creating a new Inter-Faculty cross-disciplinary Masters in Sexuality Studies, which, if accredited, will start in September 2010.

This full time / part time Taught Postgraduate programme will lead to the award of an MA in Sexuality Studies.



What is Sexuality Studies?

Sexuality Studies is a collective term for the interdisciplinary study of human sexuality. It is a term used to refer to theoretical works in the Humanities, Health-Related Sciences and Social Sciences. It focuses on issues such as sex in language, culture and society. Sexuality Studies, which also includes sexology, is the umbrella discipline which covers matters central to Gender Studies, Gay and Lesbian Studies and Women Studies. However, Sexuality Studies goes beyond these, addressing in an inter- and cross-disciplinary fashion all aspects of all human sexualities across the board.

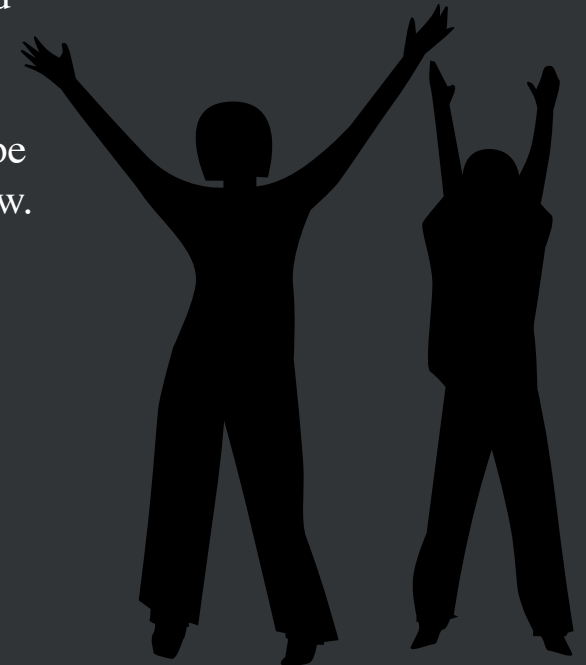
